

APPLICATIONS FOR THE KARYN AND TERRANCE HOLM VISITING SCHOLAR AWARD DUE **APRIL 1**

This award is designed to create opportunities for researchers to utilize the Midwest Nursing History Research Center's collections as well as other Chicago-area nursing and healthcare archives. The selected scholar will receive a travel and lodging stipend of up to \$1,500. Selection of the scholar will be based on the quality of the investigator's project including: the clarity of the project's purpose, its rationale and significance, and the ability of the researcher to complete the work. Preference will be given to pre-or post-doctoral work. The selected Karyn and Terrance Holm Visiting Scholar will be expected to present a paper from the funded

project in the MNHRC Harriet Fulmer Fall Lecture or the Spring Lecture series within two years of receiving the award.

DONATIONS TO THE CENTER


The Alumni Association of Cook County School of Nursing disbanded on December 31, 2017 after 85 years of support for its members, graduates of the training school at the legendary Chicago hospital. The Midwest Nursing History Research Center and UIC's Library of the Health Sciences holds extensive records of the school dating from its inception in 1929. For some years the MNHRC has held on loan a collection of silver and silver plate pieces as well as 7 letters written by Florence Nightingale and 2 letters written to her. The Alumni Association, under the presidency of Anne Klosinski, has now generously donated these items to the MNHRC at UIC. Also, in closing its financial account, Anne and the AACCSO Board of Directors have donated \$14,000 to the MNHRC in support of research in the history of nursing and \$14,000 to the CON Scholarship Fund.

CENTER ASSOCIATE—A NEW OPPORTUNITY TO SUPPORT RESEARCH IN THE HISTORY OF NURSING

The title of MNHRC Associate has been devised in order to promote historical scholarship associated with the MNHRC. Center Associates are expected to actively support scholarship in the history of nursing through participation in the Center’s activities and research in the history of nursing or the broader history of healthcare. Their scholarly work in the history of nursing will be counted as output of the center and the title of MNHRC Associate may be used in any grant application. This is NOT an administrative title and does not hold any administrative responsibilities. The appointment is for two years and is based on active support of scholarship in the history of nursing through participation in the Center’s activities and research in the history of nursing or the broader history of healthcare.

Dr. Gwyneth Milbrath, a faculty member here at the CON whose research focuses on the history of nursing, is the first MNHRC Associate. Congratulations Gwyneth!
